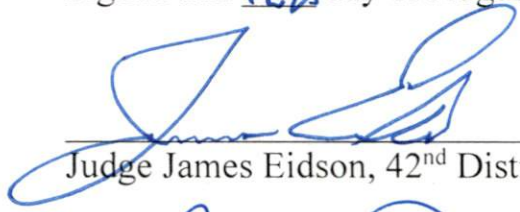
**42nd, 104th, and 350th JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURTS and TAYLOR

This is a standing order of the 42nd, 104th, and 350th Judicial District Courts and of the Taylor County Courts at Law #1 and #2 that applies in every criminal case in which a defendant is represented by counsel and is charged by indictment or information in these courts.

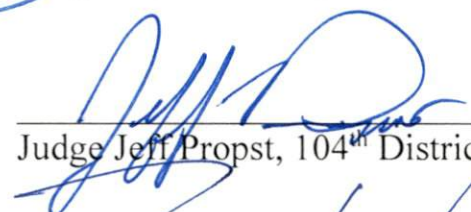
The State of Texas, by and through the Taylor County Criminal District Attorney's Office, shall permit counsel for Defendant to examine the criminal history of the Defendant as maintained by the Texas Crime Information Center/National Crime Information Center (TCIC/NCIC) by placing a copy of the Defendant's TCIC/NCIC criminal history in READ ONLY format in the discovery portal.

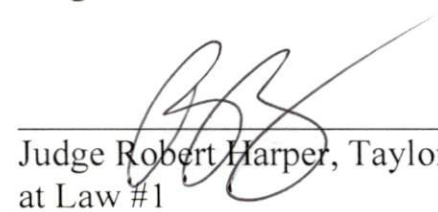

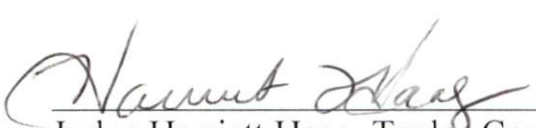
