

Recording of Court Proceedings
Probate Court Number One

1. This policy is made in conformity with the current Local Rules.
2. Recording means photographing, audio recording or video recording by any means.
3. Recording is prohibited in the Court unless written approval from the presiding Judge has been obtained and placed in the applicable case file.
4. If approval is given and the recording process becomes a distraction then approval may be revoked at the discretion of the presiding Judge.
5. Even with approval, absolutely no video will be taken of jurors.
6. Recording equipment shall be set up in advance of the commencement of the proceedings, so as not to be a distraction.
7. Zoom proceedings shall not be recorded nor shall the YouTube videos compiled from such proceedings be recorded or obtained through subpoena or any other means.
8. Any person recording outside the courtroom shall do so without creating a distraction and shall not restrict movement of persons passing through the Courtroom doors or through the Courthouse or into Court offices.
9. Any approved recordings shall not be considered part of the official Court record.
10. The Court may enforce these rules by any legal or equitable process.
11. This policy does not apply to investitures or ceremonial proceedings.
12. The effective date of this policy is the date it is executed by the presiding Judge.
